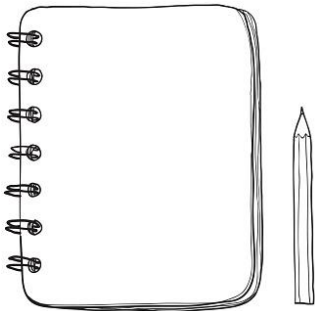

When the hands of the clock point to twelve and to two!

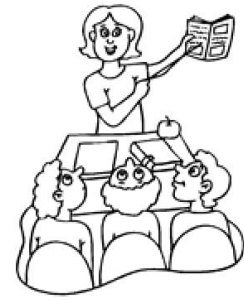

IRELAND



Ireland is a small country in the north of Europe. It is an island. Northern Ireland is part of the United Kingdom, but the rest of the island is an independent republic.

The capital city of this republic is Dublin and other important cities are Galway and Cork. There are also a lot of small towns and villages and some people live on farms in the countryside.

People in Ireland speak English or Gaelic and a lot of people can speak both. Lots of students from Spain, Italy and other countries go to Ireland to learn English, especially in the summer.

Where is it?

The Tower of London is on the River Thames, near Tower Bridge.

How can you get there?

By bus, by car, by underground (The Tube) and by boat.

How old is The Tower of London?

It's over 900 years old. It's very strong. The walls are four metres thick! It's called "The Tower of London" but there are 21 towers.

What is it famous for?

It's famous for the Crown Jewels, but also for ravens, Beefeaters and ghosts!

Who are Beefeaters?

They are special guards. There are 48 Beefeaters at the Tower. They live there. They usually wear blue and red clothes, but on special days they wear red and gold clothes.

What are ravens?

Ravens are big, black birds. Every day they eat 150 grams of meat, eggs and special biscuits made with blood.

There are six ravens at the Tower.

The legend says that White Tower will fall down if they leave.

What are the Crown Jewels?

They are the Queen's special jewels, but she only wears them once a year.

There are 2,868 jewels on the crown!

Who lives in The Tower of London?

In the past, Kings and Queens lived there, but now the Queen of England lives in Buckingham Palace. However, some people say that ghosts live in Salt Tower! They say that they only come out at night.

HALLOWEEN

Halloween is celebrated every year on October 31st. It is one of the oldest festivals in the world. It started a very long time ago when Celtic people celebrated New Year on November 1st. On the night before was the festival "Samhain" when people believed that ghosts came back to the Earth.



Celtic people lived in different parts of Europe, especially Ireland and Scotland. In those countries Halloween is still a very important festival, with parades and parties, but now most people do not believe in ghosts.

Nowadays people all around the world like to dress up at Halloween to have fun. They carve pumpkins to make lanterns to decorate houses, shops and schools. 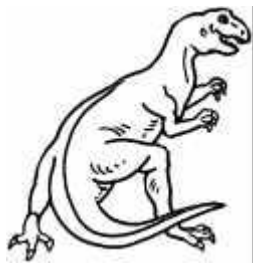
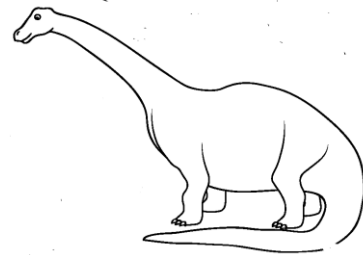


DINOSAURS

Dinosaurs were reptiles that lived on land. There were many different types of dinosaurs on the earth millions of years ago. Some were enormous, others were not so big. Some were carnivores, others were herbivores. Dinosaurs dominated the earth for over 165 million years, but mysteriously they became extinct about 65 million years ago.

Here are two different dinosaurs that lived all those years ago.

The Brachiosaurus was a huge plant-eating dinosaur with an extremely long neck. It was one of the tallest and largest dinosaurs that we know lived on the earth. This dinosaur walked on four legs. Its front legs were longer than its hind legs.



The Tyrannosaurus Rex was a huge, fierce, meat-eating dinosaur. It probably lived about 85 to 65 million years ago. This dinosaur lived in forests where herbivores could find plenty of food. These herbivores were food for the Tyrannosaurus Rex.

Emperor Penguins

Amazing Fact

Emperor penguins can dive down to 565 metres underwater - the deepest of any bird.

Feathers

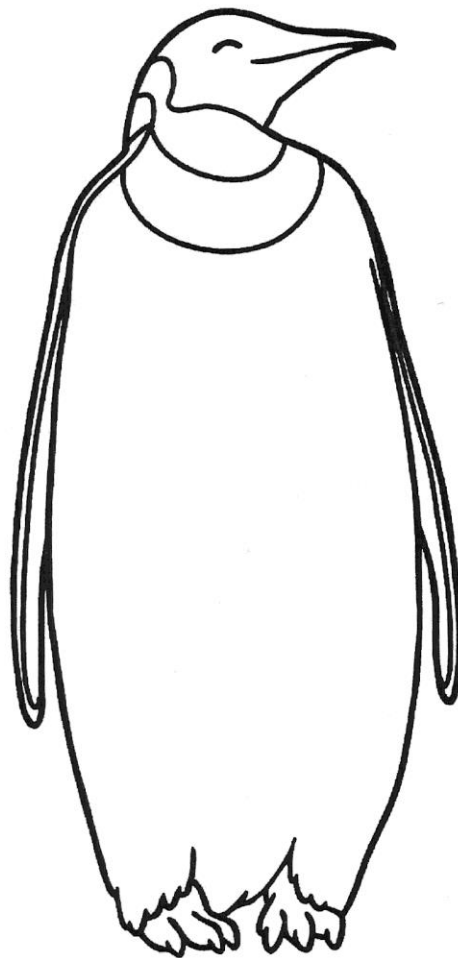
They have four layers of feathers which are waterproof and protect them from the cold.

Flippers

Their flippers are small but strong so they can swim quickly through the water.

Claws

They have strong claws so that they can grip onto the ice as they shuffle along.



Tummy

Their tummies are smooth, so that they can slide when they need to travel a long way over the ice.

Emperor penguins grow to 1.15m tall. They are the largest type of penguin and they can survive temperatures as low as -60°C ! (That's more than three times colder than a freezer!)

You could also try to find out:

- why the penguins dive so deep;
- what emperor penguins eat;
- how many different penguin species there are.

'Jurassic Park' was one of the most popular films in 1993 and won three Oscars. The American director, Steven Spielberg, made the film. It is based on a book by a writer called Michael Crichton, and it is about a scientific experiment which brings dinosaurs back to life. The dinosaurs live in a special park but they escape. They are very dangerous and they attack humans!

The film was soon very famous because it had incredible

special effects. Modern computers created the dinosaurs and their actions. For the sound of the dinosaurs, the technical experts used the sounds of elephants, crocodiles, penguins, tigers and dogs.

The film was very popular and there was a dinosaur exhibition called 'Jurassic Park' in a museum in New York. Four thousand people visited the exhibition every day. This was the start of 'Dinomania', and



now we have dinosaur toys, dinosaur models, dinosaur posters and dinosaur sweets in the shops.
