



## NASA to Let **Tourists Travel to Space Station**

What is the International Space Station (ISS)?

- The International Space Station is a spacecraft that orbits Earth.
- It's about 250 miles above Earth and is a place where scientists carry out research into space.

One small step for an astronaut could be one giant leap for holidaymakers! NASA is allowing a new form of tourism by offering guests the chance to stay at the International Space Station (ISS).

The ISS is a spacecraft that orbits the Earth. It's a place where astronauts carry out research about space, with scientists coming from all over the world to work on the station. Since 2000, there have always been scientists working there.


Now, tourists will be able to stay on the station! The trip won't be cheap — quests will pay \$35,000 (£27,500) per night. Before this announcement, NASA only allowed professional astronauts to visit the ISS.

From 2020, there will be two missions to the ISS per year for tourists. Guests will fly to the destination on an American spacecraft for a 30day mission. Two American companies, SpaceX and Boeing, are now developing spacecraft to take guests to the space station.

Once there, guests will stay in a private module which will be attached to the ISS.

Just saying you want to go, however, does not guarantee you a place. Potential customers will need to pass medical and fitness tests - the same as for normal NASA crew members. This is because they will experience a completely different environment.

But what will tourists be able to see on their voyage? Visitors will be able to look down on



Earth and travel around it every 90 minutes. All this occurs at speeds approaching 17,500mph.

Even if you can't visit yourself, you might still be able to see the Space Station hurtling across the night sky.

The news comes as NASA seeks to find ways to pay for its research. It is seeking to explore our Solar System and send another mission to the Moon by 2024.

While few people will be able to go at first, today's news may change the way we travel and spend our holidays.




## Foggy Figure

Uncle Thomas laughed. "What do you say? I packed a breakfast for us."


Mary smiled. She had smelled coffee. And Uncle Thomas had packed pastries for them,

too.





### Informative Text

#### THE ICEHOTEL

For many years the Arctic was a popular destination in the summer season to see the land of the midnight sun but in winter the few inhabitants had the snow and ice to themselves. By the end of the 1980s it was decided that the dark and cold winter should be seen as an advantage. In the winter of 1990 the French artist Jannot Derit was invited to have the opening of an exhibition in a specially built igloo (a building made of snow) in the little town of Jukkasjärvi on the frozen Torne River. The building, named Arctic Hall, attracted many interested visitors to the area. One night a group of foreign guests decided it would be a good idea to sleep in the Arctic Hall. The following morning the brave group were very pleased with their experience and the idea of an ice hotel was born. Today it is world famous.

As soon as winter begins, a team of snow builders, architects and artists from all over the world come to Jukkasjärvi and they make the hotel for that year. As one part is completed, it opens to visitors and overnight guests, while the other parts are still being built. The first part is completed in December and each week after that a new part opens, until January 7th when the hotel is completed. As the ICEHOTEL is built under the open sky, using the natural materials of the winter season, the finishing date depends on nature and therefore there are sometimes changes to the plan. In the spring, as the weather gets warmer, the hotel melts.

Inside the hotel, the temperature is never colder than -5 °C to -8 °C, however cold it may be outside. Winter outer clothes such as warm overalls, hats and gloves are included in the cost of guests' stay at the hotel. In addition to this, it is a good idea for guests to bring sweaters and a scarf as well as plenty of woollen socks and to choose footwear that is larger than normal to allow space for thick socks.

If you are planning to come to the hotel, you can buy warm sweaters, woollen socks and much more on the ICEHOTEL website. You can order these and the equipment you will need at the same time as you book your visit. The items will be delivered to your room when you check in. The hotel is in the village of Jukkasjärvi, 200 km above the Arctic Circle but only 15 km from Kiruna airport and 17 km from Kiruna train station. Transport by bus can be arranged from the airport or train station to the ICEHOTEL.






